#### **OPTION 1: Surabaya Johnny Walker (08.00 – 17.00)**

Surabaya Johnny Walker is a walking tour program organized by C2O library & collaborative that takes locals and travelers alike off the beaten track, to discover and explore the depth of Surabaya city. Immerse, learn, and be delighted with endless stories and anecdotes from local residents, artists, and researchers alike that reveal the eclectic fabric and history of the city. From diverse *kampung*/neighbourhood alleyways, ethnic quarters, port and harbors, markets boasting fresh produce and spices, to intimate quiet corners, crooked cobbled streets, and ingenious experimentation and acrobatics of working and living in Surabaya.

Surabaya Johnny Walker alludes to “Surabaya Johnny”, a song immortalized in 1929 theatre play *Happy End* by Bertolt Brecht and Kurt Weil. At the beginning of the 20th Century Surabaya was internationally known as one of the busiest, most important port cities in this part of the world. It's not the friendliest city. It can be the meanest city, with beguiling charms, not only of trade, rich culture, adventure, revolutionary history, but also of threat, exploitation, lies, and heartbreaks.

#### **A. Route**

##### **1. Tanjung Perak Voyage**

**08.00 - 11.00**

**Tanjung Perak Port – Madura Straits – Gapura Surya Nusantara Terminal**

Watch beautiful sunrise at Tanjung Perak, the busiest port in the colonial era of late 19th century - early 20th century. Travel by ferry to the Madura Island, and see various people and activities along the straits. Ends with a visit to the Gapura Surya Nusantara, one of the newly developed cruise terminals boasting some of the latest facilities in Indonesia.

**2. Arab District & China Town**

**11.00 - 15.00**

**Kampung Arab – Pecinan (Chinatown) – Pasar Pabean (Pabean Market)**

Enjoy the hustle and bustle of Monday morning in Kampung Arab and Pecinan. Exotic spice and fragrance aroma accompany our tour to dozens of alleys in Kampung Arab Surabaya. Don't forget to have a taste of kopi rempah, *spiced coffee*. We'll visit some house and interact with the owners, learn the distinctive architecture, while tasting food like sambosa and putu Belanda.

We'll then go to the Pecinan through Jalan Songoyudan, another street bustling with trade activities, and explore various alleys. We'll visit the oldest hairdresser at Jalan Kembang Jepun, and watch Wayang Potehi in Klenteng Dukuh, Hong Tiek Hian temple. We'll drop by the wet fish market, Pasar Ikan Pabean, in Jalan Panggung.

We'll make a detour for a quick lunch in Kampung Arab area, before continuing our tour.

**3. Peneleh Trip**

**15.00 - 17.00**

**Soekarno's birthplace - Tjokroaminoto's house - Peneleh Graveyard**

Kampung Peneleh is one of the oldest kampung in Surabaya. Previously, the area was a graveyard, and you can still see some of the tombstones scattered along the streets and alleys. The parents of Soekarno, Indonesia's first president, once rented a house in Jalan Pandean, where Soekarno was born. A few blocks, you will also find the house of Tjokroaminoto, where Soekarno and various revolutionary leaders like Semaoen, Alimin, Moeso, Kartosuwiryo have lived and learned. Not far from this area, we'll find an old European graveyard.

**B. Wear & Bring**

**Wear:**

1. Flat and well cushioned shoes suitable for long walk on irregular, sometimes wet/muddy, pebbly road
2. Light, loose, comfortable clothing that cover your skin. Since we're visiting Kampung Arab, please wear long-sleeved top and long bottom. Show off your sarung, trousers, etc. :)
3. Sun protection: SPF 30+ sunscreen, broad brimmed hat and sunglasses
4. If you're carrying a bag, bring one that's comfortable. We recommend you bringing a tote bag to carry items bought during the tour, or you can buy one from us :)
